FILL A FAMILY'S PANTRY CHRISTMAS MISSION

This year we altered the Family Christmas Basket Program, not only to be more manageable for our small church, but to be more supportive of our families by providing a pantry of food, not just two weeks of food. Our intent was to make a more substantial long term impact in fulfilling the needs of the families God entrusted us to help.

This year we supported three families from the Deer Park Community. The families were vetted by the local school system and One Deer Park. Along with the pantry items we provided clothing and toys for each child: a total of 82 gifts and gift cards for gas and Target for the adults.

Here are our families: 21 children ages 4 months to 17 years.

- Family One: 13 children, 5 girls, 8 boys, 2 adults
- Family Two: 2 children, 2 boys and one adult.
- Family Three: 6 children, 4 girls, 2 boys, one adult

The pantry items we provided came from the wealth of experience from the NEEDS program in Kenwood. The Pantry we provided for each family is as follows:

- Canned meats, meals, beans, fruits, vegetables, tuna, chicken, salmon, sauces, and soups
- Boxed Items: cereal, pop tarts, rice, pasta, potato dishes, stuffing. Popcorn, crackers, graham crackers, and cookies
- Baking Items and Condiments: sugar, flour, cake mix, icing, corn muffin mix, spices, salt, pepper, mustard, ketchup, and mayo.
- Miscellaneous Items: peanut butter, jelly, white vinegar, pancake mix, syrup, gravy, white and wheat bread
- Cleaning Items: dish soap, laundry soap

- Personal Care Items: toothbrushes, toothpaste, bar soap, shampoo, conditioner, razors and deodorant
- Paper Items: toilet paper, paper towels, Kleenex, diapers, and pull ups
- Dairy: mile, American cheese, eggs, butter
- Fresh Produce: apples, oranges, carrots, and potatoes
- Frozen Items: ground beef and chicken breasts

Family One received 19 boxes and 8 bags Family Two received 13 boxes and 3 bags Family Three received 15 boxes and 5 bags
